<p>NCLEX-PN – TESTING RESULTS – AS OF SEPTEMBER 30, 2025</p>	<p>NCLEX-PN – Testing Results – as of September 30, 2025. Summary results for the quarter ending September 30, 2025, are listed. These indicate that the passing rate for the West Virginia candidates for the quarter ending September 30, 2025, is 91.84%. Records reflect 238 West Virginia candidates with 219 passing. The national passing average for the quarter ending September 30, 2025, was 88.83%. The state is above the National Average. Also, provided is a listing of individual schools passing rates in WV. <p>NATIONAL COUNCIL STATE BOARD OF NURSING (NCSBN)</p>	<p>National Council State Board of Nursing (NCSBN) Annual Meeting in Chicago was held August 12, 2025. Celebrating 25th Anniversary of the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC). Lisa Shiltz and Vicki Carter attended. The Annual Meeting brought together nursing regulators across the country for discussion and voting on NCSBN business items and election of individuals to the Board of Directors and Leadership Succession Committee. This voting body</p>	

	<p>is known as the NCSBN Delegate Assembly. During the annual meeting in August this voting body convenes. The Delegate Assembly is composed of two representatives from each member board of nursing. Member boards are divided into four geographical areas of the nation, referred to as: Area I (West); Area II (Midwest); Area III (Southeast); and Area IV (Northeast). The Topic of the Annual Meeting was “Going Beyond”. There were presentations on Using AI and Best Practices, Information on Technology and Innovations in Regulation. Committee Updates, Model Rules/Legislation. Committee updates, Exam Operations, Exam Development, NCLEX Exam. Lots of exciting things are coming.</p> <p>NCSBN National Nursing Education Database in the fall of 2020 launched the Annual Report Program. This was the first-ever national program to collect annual education data from all nursing programs in participating US nursing regulatory bodies. This program is based on NCSBN’S studies of quality indicators of nursing programs. So, in conclusion of this report between 2023-2024 the 33 U.S. NRBS that participated and data collected from 1,695 programs that had enrolled 194,914 students found that this is an excellent document for benchmarking nursing</p>

	<p>education program metrics with national data.</p> <p>Additionally, with the launch of the National Nursing Education dashboard, which is interactive, programs can analyze these data with more depth.</p> <p>NCSBN U.S. Nursing Workforce by the Numbers. The National Council of State Boards (NCSBN) – the world leader in the regulatory knowledge and advancement – released its 2024 National Nursing Workforce Study. The study showed that approximately 138,000 nurses have left the workforce since 2022. The top reasons for nurses leaving besides retirement were 1. Stress and burnout 2. Workload 3. Understaffing 4. Inadequate salary and number 5. Workplace violence.</p>	
NLC UPDATE	<p>NLC Commission Annual Meeting in Chicago, August 12, 2025. As stated, before the NLC celebrated the 25th Anniversary of the Nurse Licensure Compact. Just a few things about the Compacts, to protect the public’s health and safety; cooperation of the party states in areas of nurse licensure and regulation; exchange of information between party states in the areas of nurse regulation;</p>	


	<p>compliance with the laws; hold a nurse accountable; decrease redundancies in consideration and issuance of nurse licenses and opportunities for interstate practice. Pennsylvania fully Enacted on July 07, 2025. The staff will be happy to respond to the impact the compact has had on the Board staff.</p>	
NCLEX	<p>NCLEX Exam Virtual Conference September 10, 2025. Attended by Lisa Shiltz. The conference was about the standards and definitions set by individuals who make the policy with the intentions as described on the reporting score scale for a test that was judged or developed to be consistent with the intentions of the policy. This is so the standard isn't set too low which in turn would make some candidates become qualified, which shouldn't be. Just as if you set it too high it could unqualify other candidates that should have qualified.</p>
